SALEM — Keowee Key held a groundbreaking ceremony Friday at its country club as part of a multimillion-dollar renovation plan to update, modernize and expand the lakeside retirement community.

The \$14 million makeover includes modernizing the club, expanding the Southside Pool Pavilion and Fitness and Racquet Center, updating the golf course and adding a fast-casual dining venue and another 2.5 miles of paved walking trails, according to a news release.

Keowee Key spokeswoman Christine de Vlaming said Friday's ceremony went "very well."

Projects Plan earlier this month at the Pavilion. The plan includes renovating the pool, replacing the bathhouse and adding 1,500 square feet of lounging area, according to a news release.

The pool is scheduled to open Memorial Day weekend.

The plan also includes a golf course installation led by architect Richard Mandell, whom Boardroom Magazine recently

named Golf Course Architect of the Year, according to the release. Eldridge said installation contractor Wadsworth Golf has been "flawless."
