"The Lion King" is the largest touring show on the road, with 49 cast members and almost 100 others involved in backstage support, said Jack Eldon, vice president of domestic operations for Disney Theatrical of North America.

During its Greenville run, the show is expected have an estimated \$15 million impact on the local economy.

"The Lion King" is a coming-ofage story about the lion cub Simba. The story was influenced by such diverse sources as the Biblical tales of Joseph and Moses and Shakespeare's "Hamlet."

"The Lion King" is the eighthlongest running musical in Broadway history. The score features the music of Elton John and lyrics by Tim Rice from "The Lion King" animated film, along with three new songs by John and Rice.
