## Oconee hires new county attorney, grant

five years, council decided it was time to try switching to an in-house staff attorney.

Moulder has said the county will likely continue to use McNair Law. Firm for additional specialized services.

The county is also filling the newly created position of grant writer with Sharon DeRidder, who is scheduled to begin work the first week of November, Moulder said she will be paid less than \$50,000.

"She's got substantial grant-writing experience working in Florida, and she also operates a private consulting business related to grant-writing management and project management through the grant process."
