Amy in short: It's their new Advanced Manufacturing Works.

A bit more: General Electric Co. last year announced plans to construct a new \$73 million technology center at its Greenville complex.

Construction has proceeded on schedule, and the 120,000square-foot facility will be up and running next month, said Shaun Wiggins, spokesman for GE's Power & Water unit.

Advanced Manufacturing Works will be used to develop high-tech manufacturing processes and prototypes for various lines of business, including the gas turbines built in Greenville, wind turbines made in Florida, gas engines made in Wisconsin, nuclear power services based in North Carolina and a water-purification business based in Pennsylvania, according to a June 2014 Greenville News report on the

facility's announcement.

The new facility will employ about 80 new workers. The Greenville campus, situated on more than 430 acres between Garlington, Feaster and Woodruff roads, has about 3,200 employees, Wiggins said.
