

Water line break repaired at Keowee Key

SALEM — Seneca Light and Water crews repaired a water line break at Keowee Key on Thursday and restored service to the retirement community around 5 p.m. Utilities director Bob Faires told

The Journal the community did an effective job of notifying residents of the break, and thus, Keowee Key was able to avoid exhausting the supplies in its reserve tank during the outage.

Faires said approximately 40 percent of the reserve supply remained in the water tank when

service was restored.

Residents were never without water due to the break because of the reserve tank, but Faires said once the lines were flushed and pumps turned back on, normal service resumed.
