

Clemson again named top 25 public university

CLEMSON — Clemson University is again ranked among the top universities in the country by U.S. News & World Report, according to news release from the school Tuesday.

In the 2018 edition of Best Colleges Rankings, Clemson is ranked 23rd among the top public universities, marking the 10th year it has been ranked among the nation's top 25 public schools.

"Clemson was founded on the principle that the university should be a high seminary of learning," Clemson President Jim Clements said. "That vision remains as clear today as ever, and is reflected by Clemson's inclusion among the top 25 public universities every year for the past decade."

"I am extremely proud of the great work done every day by our faculty, staff and students who make this sustained excellence possible."

The U.S. News rankings measure institutions' performance on up to 15 measures of academic quality, as well as on how they are perceived by their peers. The rankings

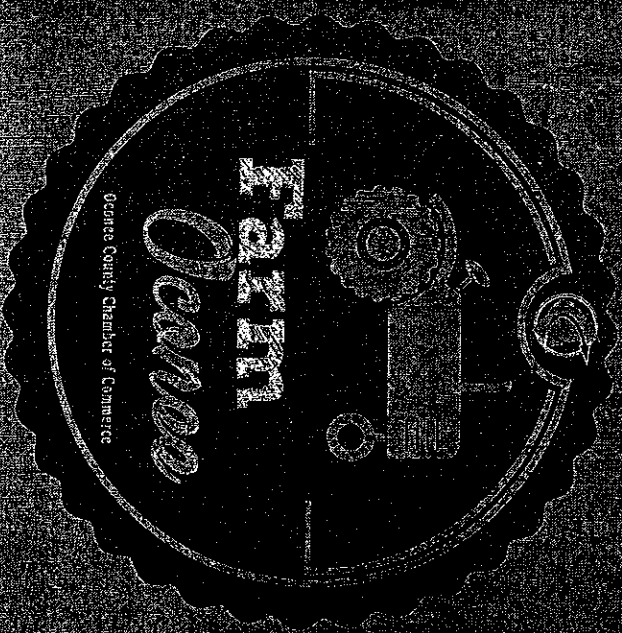


Clements emphasize outcomes, with graduation and retention rates accounting for 30 percent of the score. The top schools all have high six-year graduation rates and strong freshman retention rates.

Clemson's overall score is its highest ever. "It is exciting to be recognized as one of the country's top universities by U.S. News & World Report," Clemson provost Robert Jones said. "Many people have worked hard to make Clemson University's academics, facilities and student experience among the best. It's reflected in this recognition, and it is gratifying that Clemson has been

ranked among the top 25 public schools for 10 years in a row."
