Record performance helps Daniel golf to second-place finish at state

The Daniel High School golf team finished second in the state behind St. James in the Class 4A Tournament held Monday and Tuesday at Barony Golf Course at Port Royal.

St. James claimed the title with 607 to DWD's 612.

The second place finish was the highest finish in the history of the program.

Lady Lion Katie Whitfield finished second to earn All-State honors. Also earning All-State recognition were Emilieigh Swords (7th) and Gillian O'Brien (tied for 8th).

The Lions shot another school record round of 302

on Day 2, making up four shots from Day 1. Tuesday's scores were Whitfield Swords 77, O'Brien 79, Adrienne O'Brien 77, and Courtney Collins 90.

The two-day total of 612 was also a new school record for the Lady Lions.
