

# It's warmer than normal but not as warm as 2017

Think it's been cold this February? Think again.

This month has actually been slightly warmer than normal. So far, through Feb. 12, the Greenville-Spartanburg region has averaged 46.4 degrees, which is 2.2 degrees above normal, according to the National Weather Service station at Greenville-Spartanburg International Airport.

The top four coldest Februaries took place more than 100 years ago, with the coldest month on record coming in February 1905 with an average temperature of 33.1.

That's followed by 35.5 in 1902, 35.7 in 1904 and 36.6 in 1908.

The month of February that produced a snowstorm that blanketed Greenville in 1958 comes in as the seventh-coldest February on record with an average temperature of 36.9 degrees.

But that month doesn't register as the top snowiest February. That mark goes to February 1902, which saw 15.3 inches of snowfall in Greenville, 15 inches of that coming on Feb. 15, 1902, the all-time record.

The warmest February came last year, with an average temperature of 53.9 degrees.
