CENTRAL/CLEMSON

The 25th annual ClemsonFest will be held from 5-10 p.m. Tuesday at the Spittoono site, 1569 Eighteen Mile Road. Gates will open at 5 p.m, and the fireworks will begin at 9:30 p.m.

The award-winning Carolina Coast Band will perform beginning at 6 p.m. The band will be back onstage after the fireworks to close out the night.

The Boy Scouts of
Troop 161 will perform
a flag-raising ceremony at 5:50 p.m. and will
return at dusk for the flag
lowering and the playing

WALHALLA

MOUNTAIN REST

Mountain Rest's staple of celebration, Hillbilly Days, will hold its 59th festival from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. Wednesday at the Mountain Rest Community Club. Located at 125 Verner Mill Road, the old-fashioned event features bluegrass music, greased pigs, arts and crafts vendors, clogging and a quilt raffle. The event happens rain or shine under the 5,000-square-foot pavilion, and guests are reminded to bring chairs to be sure there's enough seating.

SENECA

An ongoing tradition for more than a decade, the city of Seneca will host its Fourth of July Celebration on Wednesday.

Funk Factory 5 will open at 6 p.m. at Gignilliat Field with a blend of Motown, Top 40 hits and beachy classics that will get the whole family dancing. There will be food vendors set up to refuel if dancing burns too many calories and cool treats to help beat the heat.
