## Best Western celebrates new ownership

SENECA — The Best Western Seneca celebrated a recent change in ownership with a ribbon cutting Tuesday at the hotel on U.S. Highway 123.

But the new owners are not new to Seneca or the hotel business.

Mehul and Tejal Patel have lived in Oconee County for the past seven years and own the Days Inn by Wyndham Seneca. The couple has two small children and became owners of the Best Western about two months ago.

"Everything is in great condition. The rooms were just recently renovated, the hotel was renovated last year," Tejal said. "We have just added our own little touch and kind of jazzed it up just a little bit. We want to let everybody know it's under new ownership. We're very excited. I come from a family of hotels. This is our first interior hotel.

It's a huge, huge milestone for me. It's a big deal."

The Patels said they believe Seneca is a good location to operate a hotel.

"We're so lucky," Tejal said.
"We're in between three lakes and the mountains. There's so much whitewater rafting, and it's close to Clemson University. The football team is amazing. I think we're in the middle of such a robust area. Seneca is just booming right now. I know seven years ago, you could tell

the activity was picking up, but not quite as much."

Her husband said the area is a good location to grow the business.

"It's been getting bigger and bigger in the years we've been here," Mehul said. "We're hoping we will expand in the future, but at the same time we want to make sure tourism expands. That's what I'm hoping for right now."
