OMH family medicine center still on track

SENECA — Oconee Memorial Hospital's Center for Family Medicine remains on schedule to open this spring, according to the hospital's chief operating officer.

OMH chief operating officer Hunter Kome told the Oconee Medical Hospital Holdings Board of Directors the project is set to open in May.

The 14,500-square-

foot building is being built in the lot next to the Cancer Institute

and will provide an expanded family medicine residency with six residents per year, spending three years at OMH.

their recruiting for that class," Kome said. "It's an extremely strong group of candidates."

Last year, Kome told The Journal the center had received accreditation and would eventually provide 18 resident physicians when fully operational, along with five faculty members.

"It's going to be a large building," he said last February.

He said the building will also be "the largest physician practice in the area by a great margin" and is expected to be completed by June 2020.

The board will meet again on May 18.
