# Slight delay for mailed tax notices

WALHALLA — There will be a slight delay in the mailing of Oconee County tax notices this year due to a computer error, but taxes can be paid online.

County attorney David Root announced a data extract error happened while the auditor's office was generating a file for a printing company.

Auditor Christy Hubbard told The Journal on Wednesday she anticipated notices would be delivered to the U.S. Postal Service by the middle of next week to be mailed out.

"The 2021 taxes are now available for review, however, and/or payment on the county website," she said. "The website data was not affected by the extract error."

"We required more information to be pulled from the data this year to populate the information we are putting on the tax notices," Hubbard explained. "I wanted the breakdown of the taxes on the notices for how it is charged — in years past, it has not always shown all of that information (and the way it is calculated). The first data pull that we did was not correct, therefore the processing company is working diligently on this so I can have the notices in the mail by mid-week next week."

Hubbard said her office was compliant with state law in having tax notices available online.

"The notices can also be printed from the county website if someone would want to have their notice today," she said in an email.
